Subject: Teaching school for summer rather than returning to  
Worthington, requests her to send her clothes and promises to pay soon  
[former boarder?]

May 16, 1848

Dear Friend

I embrace the opportunity to inform [you] that I am well and expect to remain here this summer. I am very sorry that I could not let you know sooner. My Friend wishes me to teach school for them and I have come to the conclusion to do so. I suppose it will be a disappointment to you but I could not let you know any sooner. I can make a little more and have time to work for myself. I expect their [sic] will be a house provided for me when my school is out. I will pay what I owe you as soon as I can. You will please send my clothes here as soon as you can.
