



Letter to Mary Johnson of Worthington from C.A. Weaver
of Columbus, Ohio, 6/25/1844

Subject: Encloses sample of silk fabric, bought shoes for Mary

[Handwritten note, script]

Columbus June 25, 1844

Dear Mary

I have been out in quest of the article you sent for and this I send you is the only thing If that musketo [sic] don't stop biting I'll break his back [no parentheses but evidently paused to battle a mosquito] I could find that I thought would answer the purpose excepting the sample of Silk which I will send It would be nearer the thing It is worth 62 1/2 a yard this I paid 20 cents for If this should not answer, I will get the Silk and send you. I Payed [sic] for your shoes \$1.25 They said they were sorry your credit was so poor with them. Got home safe last evening. No news in Town today. But very warm My respects to your Mother, with any quantity of Love to Your Self
