Complete charge will be \$450.00

Total charge to be a minimum of \$675.00 for 10 lessons. Tuition is to be paid $\frac{1}{2}$ when enrollment is complete and first lesson given. Balance on 4th due or @ end of 1st month.

Party for each class held on Sunday p.m. in Studio for children & parents.

75 for P.M. & 150 night is minimum enrollment. Additional tickets can be

sold @ 45¢ each & proceeds to go to Activity. After tuition is pd. no additional charge to be made by the studio. Interviewed Miss Bernard from the Murray studio.

- (2) Contacted Mrs. Anderson at A. Murray's. Interviewed Miss Corday & Mr. Jenkins from Jimmy Rawlins School and they showed films & pictures of classes. Would give us 1 teacher in afternoon for \$25.00 and 2 in evening for \$35.00. Prices at studio are \$18 for 12 lessons.

- (3) Interviewed Mr & Mrs. Robert Potts of 2886 Neil Av. (JE-8033). They taught at Q.S.G. with Kit Simons until her death, a period of 17 years. They now teach in Columbus and manage the Kit Club in Newark. They have kept up-to-date by studying in New York with Mr. Durand of the Estelle Studio. They will both teach in afternoon & evening. One hour in afternoon and 1 1/2 hour in evening (last 1/2 hour for practice) and doors to be opened early for introductions so that a full hour of actual teaching can be given.

They have been told what our children need and want in the way of new steps and will teach same. They will teach Continental, South American and a few country dances.

Their price is \$2.50 for afternoon and \$3.50 evening and payable at any time the club desires properly currently as last year's method.

The committee of Hartman, Price & Moody and officers Naager & Griffith decided to hire Mr & Mrs. Robert Batts and classes will start on Oct 6 and end Dec. 15 with our Xmas parties. It was voted by the committee to stress the sale of season tickets to all schools in the township and the recommendation was made to raise the price to \$4.00 and to have single admissions at 50¢. Other plans for handling admissions were discussed by the committee. The president also contacted the past presidents and the secretary before interviewing any teachers and it was the unanimous opinion that we should get the best for our children even at a greater cost.
