In 1965 a group of four women spoke to a gathering in Kansas City about their personal experiences of racial and religious prejudice. Then and there "The Panel of American Women" was born.

Today there are over 800 women involved in 60 cities in their efforts toward community understanding. The Columbus Panel made its first appearance in November of 1963.

Come and meet four of these extraordinary women Wed., March 28, at 8 p.m. at the Worthington Methodist Church. It's the monthly public program of the Worthington Human Relations Council, and everybody is welcome.

Mrs. Irmgard Modlich, speaking from a Catholic background. Miss Romaine Bayliss is the black panelist. Mrs. Phyllis Wasserstrom is the Jewish panelist, and Mrs. Cindy Swearingen represents the white majority.

After the panelists speak, the group will have an opportunity to ask questions. We urge you to bring a friend or neighbor who has had little chance to speak frankly with people of different back-grounds. The amendment, as proposed, is: "Trustees shall be expected to attend all meetings of the Board unless required by other obligations to be absent. Absence from 3 successive meetings of the Board burn, Olwen Firestone, Jane Cole shall be considered evidence of the Julie Smith, Jeanne Eason, wish not to continue as a trustee. The Secretary shall therefore,

after an absence from three consecutive meetings, direct a letter to the trustee asking if he wishes to remain a trustee. If an affirmative reply is received, he shall be retained, except that following a repeat of absence from 2 successive meetings, he shall automatically be removed from the Board."

SB 105--from page 2--psychological murder," said Sylvester Corbin Wednesday when he testified at the initial state Senate Education Committee hearing on SB 105, which would mandate B-of-E guidelines for a "balanced presentation of (black) history...in history courses in public high schools."

"Ive been required to study Roman history, world history, American history and Pennsylvania history, said Mr. Corbin, a retired Army veteran, but I've never been required to study my own history."

Dr. Harold Horton of Capital U. said, "Few school texts adequately portray black contributions, or the harshness of life in the ghetto."
